Outcomes

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Curriculum Outcomes

Students will be expected to:

- demonstrate an understanding of the importance of good hygiene and personal appearance when interacting with others
- demonstrate correct body positioning and appropriate eye contact to convey joint attention and readiness for a conversation with a partner
- compare expected and unexpected behaviours in a group
- demonstrate an understanding that people have thoughts of their own and that what people look at can give clues to what they are thinking about
- identify and demonstrate perspective taking
- demonstrate how to use appropriate reciprocal conversational skills
- demonstrate how to find common interests by trading information with others
- demonstrate how to enter and exit conversations with peers
- identify when and how to use humour appropriately
- demonstrate strategies to handle rejection, teasing, and bullying behaviour
- identify and apply, when appropriate, strategies to handle rumors and gossip
- identify and demonstrate the components to hosting get-togethers
- identify and demonstrate appropriate ways to communicate with friends through phone calls, text messages and other social media
- demonstrate understanding of, and strategies to manage emotion regulation
- demonstrate strategies for positive interactions with peers during group activities
- identify and demonstrate strategies to handle arguments and disagreements
- identify common interest which might be a good match for friendship opportunities.
- identify and demonstrate strategies to effect positive behaviour change
- identify the similarities and differences between friendships and romantic relationships,
- demonstrate strategies used to begin and maintain relationships, and identify when and how to end a relationship
- demonstrate an understanding of public versus private body parts and behaviours
- identify what constitutes consent between people and why it is important
