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Curriculum Outcomes

Students will be expected to

- demonstrate an understanding of the importance of good hygiene and personal appearance when interacting with others
- demonstrate how to position their body and use eye contact to convey joint attention and preparedness for an interaction with conversational partners
- demonstrate the understanding that people have thoughts of their own and that what people look at can give clues to what they are thinking about
- be expected to articulate expected and unexpected behaviours in a group
- identify and demonstrate perspective taking
- demonstrate how to use appropriate reciprocal conversational skills
- demonstrate how to find common interests by trading information with others
- demonstrate when and how to use humour appropriately
- demonstrate how to enter and exit conversations with peers
- demonstrate strategies to handle rejection, teasing, and bullying
- identify and demonstrate strategies to handle rumors and gossip
- demonstrate how to be a good host during get-togethers
- identify, and demonstrate how to communicate with friends through phone calls, text messages and other social media
- demonstrate positive strategies for interacting with peers during group activities
- demonstrate understanding of, and strategies to manage emotion regulation
- identify and demonstrate strategies to handle arguments and disagreements
- be able to identify and demonstrate strategies to effect positive behaviour change
- identify qualities of a good match for friendships
- be able to identify the difference between making friends and having romantic friendships and identify and demonstrate strategies for each
- identify and demonstrate understanding of public versus private behaviours, body parts and what consent constitutes
