Help students build their tax knowledge this Financial Literacy Month

November marks Financial Literacy Month in Canada, and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) is dedicated to helping youth build their tax knowledge, skills and confidence, both in the short-term and later in life.

We offer a range of tools and resources to help young people prepare for tax filing and for accessing important benefits and credit payments. Keep reading to learn more!

Why should students file a tax return?

Every year, students need to [file an income tax and benefit return](#) if they:

- would like to receive a tax refund they may be owed;
- would like to receive any benefits or credits they may be eligible for;
- have to pay tax for the year.

Students should still file even if they have little or no income. Depending on their income and family situation, they may be eligible to receive benefit and credit payments, such as the goods and services tax/harmonized sales tax (GST/HST) credit.

They could also claim deductions and credits to help with things like:

- [tuition costs](#);
- [moving expenses](#);
- [interest paid on student loans](#).

[Learn about your taxes](#) is a free self-paced online learning tool designed to help young people understand what taxes are, how to do them, how to read a pay stub, and more. Through our 5-minute lessons and quizzes, students can get a basic understanding of what benefit and credit payments they could be eligible for.
